

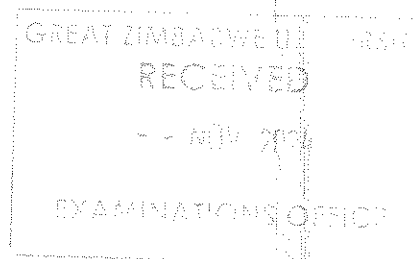

QUESTION ONE: COMPULSORY (40 MARKS)

Read the following passage: First night in a foreign country

“The first night I was on the street I slept under a tree. Then the police came and they just fetched the girls. We thought maybe they just picked the girls to take us somewhere safe. They took us to Albert Park and then they just pointed to one of my friends. Her name was Nutanka, and then they just abused her and when she came out she was naked. They were trying to do something to me but I kept on screaming for other people and they didn’t do anything to me. They just put the pepper spray on us and hit us with the sjambok [leather whip]. I was 13 or 14, I am not sure. I will never forget what the police did to my friend.” Precious, South Africa.

Required:

1. Discuss possible reasons for the police to fetch the girls only from the street **(20 marks)**.
2. With well-elaborated justification, suggest possible reasons for Precious not forgetting the experiences of this night **(20 marks)**

QUESTION THREE

Using examples from southern Africa, distinguish between any two theories of migration showing how each treats gender related issues (30 marks)

QUESTION FOUR

‘People have been known to move from place to place because of push and pull factors’. Discuss this assertion in relation to the current movement of women in Zimbabwe (30 marks).

QUESTION FIVE

With the aid of practical examples from the southern Africa region, assess the link between gender and human trafficking (30 marks).
