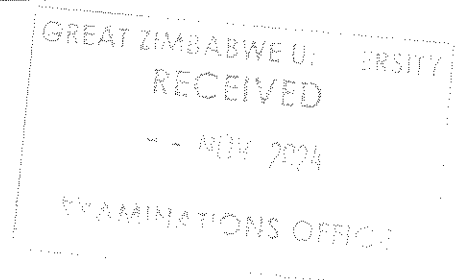

Question 1:

Community Empowerment and Transformation (CET) is a not-for profit organization operating in Masvingo Province. It does programming in the democracy and governance, working to promote youth participation in electoral processes in the seven districts of Masvingo province. Giving examples, explain the four major types of risks that can be faced by CET. In your answer describe how each type of risks can be managed. (20)

Question 2:

Community Empowerment and Transformation (CET) is a community based organization programming in health, livelihoods and also democracy and governance issues. The directors of CET have just appointed you as the monitoring, evaluation, accountability and learning (MEAL) officer for its operations. The directors have tasked to:

- a) Explain the risk management process that you will follow in your new role. (10)
- b) Describe the features of the risk management framework that supports the risk management process you will use. (10)

Question 3:

The use of risk registers have become established practice for many risk management practitioners. Suppose the directors of Together Brethren in Action (TBA), a regional non-governmental organization, operating to support the victims of conflict in Africa and Asia have appointed you as the monitoring, evaluation, accountability and learning officer for its operations.

- a) Explain the advantages and disadvantages of using a risk register in your work (10)
- b) Design a basic risk register for TBA; your risk register should include at least 5 identified risks. (10)

Question 4:

Reputation is a component of the FIRM risk scorecard and is generally considered to be a consequence of other events that occur. As the Chief Risk Officer (CRO) of Community Empowerment and Transformation (CET), a not for profit organization programming in livelihoods projects, you are required to:

- a) Describe the various components of reputation for CET. (10)
- b) Explain the different threats to CET's reputation (10)

Question 5:

Suppose you are appointed as the new monitoring, evaluation, accountability and learning (MEAL) officer for Community Empowerment and Transformation (CET), a community based organization in Masvingo. The directors of CET require you to:

- a) Identify the barriers to the implementation of a successful risk management initiative. (10)
- b) Explain the key guidelines that should be followed for risk communication in CET. (10)
